### **February 13, 2012 | Introduction to Pediatric Trauma/Airway**

Designed to provide the initial basic and advanced critical elements for management of the severely injured patient, this course focuses on the first minutes of a trauma situation: the patient's airway and clinically securing it, stabilizing breathing and obtaining control of hemorrhage.

### **May 21, 2012 | Non-accidental Trauma: Big Problems for Little Patients**

There are subtle presentations that a pre-hospital health care provider must be aware of to effectively uncover the source of non-accidental trauma, or child abuse. We'll review relevant recent literature and use a case-based approach to highlight key presentations, physical exam findings and subtle clues to identify children suffering from abuse. We will also discuss the legal mandates of the pre-hospital health care provider.

Signs and symptoms and basic assessment tips are provided as well as an identification of assessment obstacles. Airway and common respiratory disorders are covered including croup, epiglottitis, foreign body aspiration, pneumonia, bronchiolitis, and cystic fibrosis.
